No Budget funding for Penang!

CHIEF Minister Lim Guan Eng has described the Budget 2016 as a sheer, outright, blatant marginalisation of Penang.

"Penang contributed RM6.3 billion to the federal government and yet, we get nothing in return. Only a mere 2%. We shall have to press on with our state projects and find our own resources," Lim said in a press conference at Komtar on Oct 24

"The federal government is going to collect at least RM21

billion from the people through GST (Goods and Services Tax). Yet, how much is it giving back to the rakyat? It is akin to taking RM26 from the people and giving them RM1!" he added.

"This is malicious discrimination which we feel is unfair. It certainly does not respect the constitution of the country as Penang is also part of Malaysia. Clearly, the budget aims to check and stifle growth of Penang. Although we are disappointed and upset at being discriminated, we have to go on," Lim said.

He also questioned why

Malacca was given allocations to expand its local airport when the state only gets five to six flights a week.

"While it is good for Malacca, why is Penang International Airport not given any allocation although it is operating at over capacity? Under Budget 2016, there is nothing for Penang's public transport. Although the Prime Minister had promised three times to

build the LRT, nothing has been allocated," Lim said.

Lim described the Budget 2016 as "indah khabar dari rupa" (Too good to be true).

"It is unfair. Penang gets nothing! I am very disappointed. No new projects were announced for Penang," Lim added.

He also pointed out that the federal government expects to collect at least RM21 billion

in GST from the 30 million Malaysians.

"Once again, we appeal for the abolition of GST. As long as the GST is imposed, the rakyat has to bear the burden of RM21 billion."

Furthermore, Lim pointed out that Budget 2016 had no measures to arrest the declining value of the ringgit.

"There is no measure to salvage the ringgit," he said.

Commission of Inquiry report released

THE much-anticipated Report of the Commission of Inquiry into the Failure of Two Civil Structures in Penang, namely the structure at Umno building and the collapse of a section of the Penang Second Bridge, was released on Nov 2 and members of the press were each given a printed copy and a CD. The report will also be available for the public at RM200 per set.

The two tragedies that happened within a week shocked Penangites.

On June 6, 2013, the ramp of the Penang Second Bridge which was under construction then collapsed and killed motorist Tajuddin Zainal Abidin.

The following week on June 13 the lightning arrestor of the Umno building at Jalan Macalister crashed and killed Lim Chin Aik and another motorist.

At a press conference in Komtar on

Oct 28, Chief Minister Lim Guan Eng informed members of the media that the report was completed on April 28 and had been translated to Bahasa Malaysia and compiled.

However, the two reports were only

released to the public after they had been seen and endorsed by the Penang Governor.

The commission was headed by Datuk Yeoh Yang Poh, and its members were Datuk Roslan Hashim and Datuk Dr. Gue See Sew.

Tajuddin's widow and his youngest brother Laidin Zainal Abidin were at the Chief Minister's office to receive a copy of the reports.

"Although the incident happened two years ago, I am sure your loss is still painful. With this report, I hope it answers some of your questions on the cause," Lim said when he handed the copy to Tajudin's widow.

The late Tajudin left behind four children.

Penang has high income jobs lined up

SOME mainstream media have alleged that factories are closing down and workers laid off

However, this was quickly dismissed by investPenang director Datuk Lee Kah Choon (pix) in a press briefing on Oct 27 at his office in PSDC Bayan Baru.

Lee first explained to the press how the fast paced semi-conductor industry moved and evolved.

"We are lucky that we have Intel and Dell that have been around for 40 years. It is not surprising that some of the businesses change. For example, from laptops people are now moving into mobile technology. Penang has the supply chain and industries. Mergers and acquisition take place," Lee said

"Penang is very resilient. We have the human talent to serve the industries. Do you remember how once Motorola used to manufacture the mobile phones which were huge? Now Motorola is still here and they are into research and development. Penang has high income jobs lined up for Penangites," Lee added.

"As far as jobs are concerned, we are still very, very stable. Plenty of positions are to be filled. However, we are not complacent and investPenang works closely with the industries. We will fight every



inch of the way to get investments. Workers can easily be absorbed into other industries and we assist these workers to get jobs," he continued.

Lee also refuted press allegations that several factories are closing down. He asked the press: "Where did you get this information? I got it from trusted sources in the mentioned factories and they had not confirmed they are doing as rumoured."

InvestPenang released its full press statement with all the facts and data which provides the information on employment, mergers and acquisitions and others.

Unlicensed hotels warned

OVER the last few weeks, several unlicensed hotels had their rooms demolished and furniture removed.

"MBPP will continue to act against those who operate a hotel without licence. There are 23 new cases and demolition is ongoing. The last will be the first to go, that is new hotels which just opened without obtaining the proper licences will be the first to be demolished," Penang Island City Council (MBPP) Building Control director Yew Tung Seang warned.

"However, some of the 23 hotels have ceased operations pending approval of licences. MBPP building inspectors will be monitoring the situation. Ample time has been given to premises owners and those intending to operate hotels and MBPP had also held dialogues and briefings to assist them," Yew added.

In a joint operation on Oct 28, some 40 MBPP enforcement officers, who were separated into two groups, raided two hotels in Jalan Datuk Keramat and

Jalan Macalister

This brings to four the number of illegal hotels raided by the council since the start of the operation last month to clamp down on unlicensed hotels.

During the raid, the two unlicensed hotels has their signboards removed, illegal structures demolished and items like mattresses and television sets seized.

On Oct 22, an illegal hotel in the heart of George Town was issued a compound for RM250 and had some of its items seized.

"The operations involves the whole of the island, including the George

Town Unesco World Heritage enclave," MBPP assistant officer for Building Control Mohd Nizam Saad told reporters after the raid.

At the same press conference, MBPP licensing officer Mohamad Hasan

Abdul Rahman said the illegal hotels that have been issued compounds were still subjected to raids if they did not adhere to guidelines set by the council.

 As the State's investment promotion agency, investPenang wishes to address the current spate of on-line news and speculations regarding corporate movements of a few semicon/ E&E multinationals in Penang.

- In today's industries and business, mergers and acquisitions are commonly carried out not only to consolidate operations but also for other reasons such as increase in market share and technology synergies. This is happening globally in the semicon and E&E technology companies and Penang, as an electronic hub, with its many international companies, is invariably impacted.
- 3. In 1H 2015 alone, globally, \$72.6 billion worth of M&A were announced. This was more than four times the value of M&A reported in fiscal 2014. The 3 major M&A include:
 - \$37 billion acquisition of Broadcom by Avago
 - \$16.7 billion acquisition of Altera by Intel
 - \$11.8 billion acquisition of NXP Semiconductor by Freescale.
- 4. In Penang, 5 multinationals recently announced their M&As:

a. AMD joint venture with Nantong Fujitsu Microelectronic Co.

85% share in AMD's manufacturing sites in Penang and Suzhou, China were sold to Nantong Fujitsu Microelectronics for \$371 million cash; with AMD retaining 15% stake. The manufacturing site in Penang will remain in operation. The JV is the "latest step in AMD's strategic transformation to further sharpen focus and operations on designing high-performance products." The company announced that "there are no planned workforce reductions in Penang AMD facility". The deal expected to be closed first half 2016, as long as regulatory and other approvals are obtained.

b. Sanmina Corp to take over Motorola Solutions' manufacturing facility in Bayan Lepas.

Motorola's manufacturing in Technoplex facility will be taken over by Sanmina Corp, a leading integrated manufacturing service provider; whilst it focuses on R&D in Penang. They confirmed that the "sale does not change Motorola's commitment in Malaysia" and "allows Motorola Solutions to deliver best in class service to its partners and customers". They also reported in a local press on Oct 14th, 2015 that the "transfer does mean there will be a reduction in staffs". Employees will be transferred to Sanmina at no lesser terms than what they currently have. The transaction is expected to be finalized by early 2016.

c. Western Digital acquiring SanDisk

WD announced on 21 Oct 2015, its plan to acquire SanDisk for \$19B cash and stock. The deal is scheduled to be closed by Q3 2016. There are currently 1042 employees in SanDisk Penang.

d. Amphenol to close one part of its business.

Amphenol is consolidating its mobile consumer products division in Asia Pacific, closing one of its plants in Penang. 150 employees will be affected. The company will continue manufacturing of high speed connectors in 2 other plants in Penang, employing 800 staffs.

e. Dell acquired EMC at \$67billion

Acquisition, announced on 12 Oct, 2015, was made to 'evolve the company into the most relevant areas where IT is moving'.

From the above, it can be seen that only 150 jobs in Penang are affected. More job consolidation could be happening due to other M&As but there are no news of closure to- date. Corporate movements will impact Penang, as host to many MNCs, and also other States in Malaysia.

- 5. In Penang, investments in the manufacturing sector remain robust. Recently, Jinko Solar as well as JA Solar, both multinational Chinese companies, started operations in Penang offering a total of 1,900 jobs. HP is currently constructing their factory in Batu Kawan and will employ 1,000 staff when it is in full operation. Overall, according to MIDA, a total of 17,896 new jobs will be created in Penang via approved investments in 2014 and 13,199 new jobs via approved investments in 1H 2015.
- Penang managed to attract RM48.2 billion worth of investments from 2008 to 2014, which is 93% higher than the RM24.9 billion invested on a similar 6 year period from 2001 to 2007.
- 7. In addition to manufacturing, the services sector, especially Global Business Services and Shared Services Outsourcing continues to offer high value job opportunities. HP recently started a finance centre at PDC Technoplex. Others include Osram's GBS center employing 150 staff and Jurong Engineering Design Center with 200 staff.
- The Penang Career Assistance and Talent (CAT) Center continues to provide assistance to job seekers and employers looking for right candidates. As at 26 Oct, 2015, a total of 3,246 vacancies in Penang can be found in job portals linked to the CAT Centre.
- 9. The State government via investPenang is working closely with companies that have made announcements to assist and smoothen transition. However, for companies that have yet to make any official statements, due to confidentiality requirements at this stage or other reasons, whenever they can, we urge them to clarify matters to quell the spread of rumours. Further updates and clarifications will be given by investPenang when necessary.
- 10. As an international city where many multinationals are located, Penang will be subjected to vagaries of global business trends directly. We however remain positive in facing these challenges and steadfast in assisting all our investors and employees.

Concern over Mount Erskine road crash rate

THE whole stretch of Mount Erskine Road is an accident prone area and coupled with the fact that its terrain is steep and hilly at certain intervals and the speed limit of 60 km per hour is often overlooked by road users, the public is advised to take precautions and to report on Facebook of any accident taking place in the area.

Commenting on this matter was Pulau Tikus assemblymember Yap Soo Huey who on Oct 20 paid a visit to accident victim Loh Gnai Chun at his home.

Loh, 30, who is confined to a wheelchair on a temporary basis and is recuperating at home, met with an accident on Sept 28 when he was hit by a car while riding his motorcycle home at 7.30pm after his usual jogging session at the Botanical Gardens

"I have since 2013 kept in contact with the Public Works Department (JKR) and the Engineering Department of the Penang Island City Council (MBPP) to come up with ways and means to reduce the speed of vehicles from the Puncak Erskine flats area to the Mount Erskine market area which is under the jurisdiction of JKR," Yap told members of the press.

"Errant motorists tend to neglect the safety of pedestrians, bus passengers and motorcyclists who reside on both sides of Mount Erskine Road," she said.

There were visible scars on Loh's left

cheek in which titanium plates were inserted into his face by doctors who attempted to reconstruct his injured face.

He also dislocated his right hip in the accident.

Yap also advised concerned members of the public to report or to post on a new Facebook page which her office had set up.

"Due to lack of data by the relevant authorities, I hope concerned residents of Mount Erskine area would post on this Facebook page reports of any accident since 2012 or 'near miss' taking place here which you're aware of. This would greatly assist these government agencies to plan and to channel their resources to plan the traffic system in this area," Yap added.

People are losing trust in certain media

CHIEF Minister Lim Guan Eng has hit out at certain media whose news reporting is slanted.

"We are working in a very hostile media environment. However, the people are losing trust in the media. They are not ignorant and know which media news is slanted and which is not. I make no apologies for stating this," Lim said in a press conference in Komtar on Oct 31.

Lim was earlier asked about certain media which reported that factories are closing down in Penang although statistics and press briefings had been provided by investPenang which proved that this not the case.

Lim said some of these media are facing falling circulation and nobody, especially in Penang, bothers to read them.

"I don't know whether to laugh or otherwise. Newspapers can put report front page news which is not true. Yet, when we reply, it is either not published or given a very tiny space. When we talked about positive aspects of Penang, we will be completely ignored. Yet, when any party criticises Penang, it will be on front page in certain media," he added.

To illustrate his point, Lim asked members of the press who were at the press conference: "Do you all recall how certain media claimed that tourists are not coming to Penang? Yet, today, Penang has been chosen as the fourth charismatic city in the world by Lonely Planet."

KDU College was the host for the workshop which saw some 100 journalism students from KDU Penang, Universiti Sains Malaysia (USM) and TAR College attending.

The workshop began with a welcoming address from Evelyn Lim, Academic Department Head of KDU Mass Communication Department.

Following that, Dr. Prema Devaraj (pix), programme consultant for WCC, conducted the first session titled "Sexual Crimes and Vulnerable Victims".

She started by introducing sexual crimes and the vulnerability of victims, especially children, who have been sexually abused.

She then went on to explore some common misconceptions of sexual crimes.

In the following session, Dr. Shakila Manan, associate professor from USM, conducted a case study on the news reporting surrounding the rape-murder of Noritta Samsudin in 2003.

This case study explored how the gradual build-up of negative reporting surrounding Noritta caused the perception of her to shift from being the victim of a monstrous crime to her seemingly having contributed to her own death due to her perceived immorality.

The third session by Joshua Teh, advocacy officer for WCC, revealed the results of a ground-breaking four-month media survey conducted by WCC in 2014 on reporting of sexual crimes involving children.

He explored how placing a combination of identification markers such as the victim's age, address, and parents' occupation, among others, in a news report could lead to the identification of the victim.

The final session was a panel discussion on "Ethical Journalism and Moving Forward".



Moderated by Joshua Teh, Prema was joined by Dr. Mustafa Kamal from the Penang Institute and Himanshu Bhatt, a senior journalist, on several key issues raised throughout the course of the workshop.



Urging youth to join NGOs

YOUTHS have been urged to play a more active role in non-governmental organisations (NGOs) and to use such available platforms to make changes to the livelihood of people.

Such were the words of activist Fahmi Zainol at a dialogue titled "After Bersih 4: To Where We're Heading?" on Sept 17.

N95 masks donated to MBPP

The term N95 refers to the filter class of the mask.

The "N" refers to the filter's

oil resistance classification as "Not resistant to oil", and the 95 suggests that the mask filters out at least 95% of airborne

"Apart from these 1,000 masks, MBPP has also ordered around 4,000 N95 valve respirator masks for all our staff. Priority will be given to the Urban Services (JPP), enforcement officers, and building inspectors as they have to work while dealing with the worsening haze on a daily basis," Ng

Clear message on the haze

GROWING concerns over the worsening haze situation in Penang prompted a group of elected representatives to submit a memorandum to the Indonesian Consulate along Jalan Burma on Oct 23.

Led by state exco member for Agriculture & Agro-Based Industry, Rural Development and Health Dr. Afif Bahardin, other members of his entourage included exco members Phee Boon Poh (Welfare, Caring Society and Environment) and Danny Law Heng Kiang (Tourism Development and Culture) and assemblymembers Cheah Kah Peng (Kebun Bunga) and Yap Soo Huey (Pulau Tikus).

Copies of the memorandum which bore the signatures of the three exco members and addressed to Indonesian President Joko Widodo were distributed to the members of the press.

"The current haze crisis has been an ongoing affair since early September 2015 and it affects neighbouring Singapore as well as several provinces in Indonesia. Penang is also facing this crisis for several weeks and we have witnessed several episodes in which readings exceeding 200 have been recorded on the Air Pollution Index (API). It is most unfortunate that this is not the first time such a hazy catastrophe is affecting us," Dr. Afif read from a copy of the memorandum.

The state government, in the memorandum, also urged the Indonesian government to adhere to Principle 21 of the Stockholm Declaration which

"States have, in accordance with the Charter of the United Nations and the principles of in-

ternational law, the sovereign right to exploit their own resources pursuant to their own environmental policies, and the responsibility to ensure that activities within their jurisdiction or control do not cause damage to the environment of other States or of areas beyond the limits of national jurisdiction".

Receiving the memorandum on behalf of the Indonesian government was Sofiana Mufidah who is in charge of consular affairs.

In response to the memorandum, the Indonesian consulate also issued a separate statement which mentioned the remedial steps that have been taken by its government in addressing this environmental catastrophe and to reiterate the fact that Widodo viewed the matter with grave concern and was also most appreciative of the assistance his government received from neighbouring countries in terms of equipment and personnel to combat the forest fires.

CHIEF Minister Lim Guan Eng has assured that the Penang state government is a government that listens.

Lim said this at the Real Estate and Housing Developers Association (Rehda) Penang 41st anniversary dinner on Oct 28.

Rehda has a membership of 102 and plays its role in ensuring sustainable and orderly growth of the housing and property industry.

Rehda Penang chairman Datuk Jerry Chan talked about integrity and appealed to the government that the industry needs help.

Chan was referring to the delay in 47 advertising permit and development licences (APDL) where an estimated 5,000 units of homes are affected.

"Without the APDL, we cannot sell or promote the projects as well as finalise the sales and purchase agreements," he said.

"The GST has also increased the cost

of doing business," he added.

Meanwhile, in his speech, Lim agreed that the delay in the APDL by the Urban Wellbeing, Housing and Local Government Ministry and the GST had caused a great burden.

"I know that it is very challenging for the industry. But, we should not feel gloomy. Penangites are resilient. Penangites are tough. I am sure we will overcome these crises. Never give up. Things may seem hard and dark. But it is always the darkest before dawn. Penang never surrenders. We are here to stay!" Lim said.

His speech was met with cheers and applause.

During the dinner, Rehda also contributed RM15,000 to an old folks home and children shelter home as part of its corporate social responsibility programme.

Penang Deputy Chief Minister I Datuk Mohd. Rashid Hasnon, state exco members Chow Kon Yeow, Datuk Abdul Malik Kassim, Law Heng Kiang, assemblymembers and councillors were also present.

Jagdeep criticises housing allocations in Budget 2016

JAGDEEP Singh Deo, exco member for Housing and Town & Country Planning recently hit out at Budget 2016

"The budget is very disappointing. Is the Prime Minister who is also the Finance Minister ill-advised? The entire housing industry knows that the housing loan rejection for first time home buyers is very high. Therefore, there is no logic at all for the setting up of funds to help first time home buyers to pay the deposit. If the first time home buyer cannot even afford the deposit, how are they going to service the loan?" Jagdeep asked.

"The grandiose announcement of the budget means nothing. It is the same old package of recycled products. For example, RM155 million was announced for the TP1M (Tabung Perumahan 1Malaysia) which is meant for repairs and maintenance of high-rise public housing and low-cost flats. However, every year Pen-

ang's applications are hard to be approved," he added.

"If I may suggest to the Prime Minister cum Finance Minister, he should use the RM2.6 billion reportedly donated to him as a revolving trust fund to help first time home buyers to purchase a home. In Western Australia, they have the Keystart programme to help people to buy a home through shared ownership," Jagdeep said.

Having expressed his disappointments at the recent budget, Jagdeep revealed that the Penang state government is looking at innovative method to ensure that the people, especially the first time home buyers, get a home.

He said further details will be released soon but it is a positive step towards home ownership.

"Looks like we have to look into this matter ourselves. That way, we will be able to improve the take up rate of affordable homes," Jagdeep said.

Property summit returns

PENANG Property Summit 2016 (PIP) to be held at the SPICE Arena on Jan 8-10 promises to be a game changer.

Exco member for Housing and Town & Country Planning Jagdeep Singh Deo said that due to last year immense success, it is crucial to hold such events at least twice a year.

"The property sector is an evolving one and every minute there are changes. Therefore, it

is important to get stakeholders together to better enhance the delivery of housing to the people," he said at the press conference to announce the summit.

The PIP will take place for the second time and is a collaboration between the Penang State Housing Committee and PenEvents.

The three-day programme will see 200 prominent industry players gathering for some brainstorming.

Thirty exhibitors will also showcase their properties ranging from affordable homes to high-end condos and homes.

The future of Penang is in Seberang. Therefore, one of the lecture series will feature speakers like exco member for Local Government, Traffic Management and Flood Mitigatin Chow Kon Yeow, Penang City mayor Datuk Patahiyah Ismail and Seberang Perai Municipal Council chief Datuk Maimunah Shariff. They will be talking about 'Challenges and Opportunities for Penang - The island achieving City

Status and the future of the Mainland'. There will also be a panel discussion on the opportunities for property development on the mainland," Jagdeep said.

Squatters issue settled amicably

IT was an exciting day for some Sungai Nibong residents when they viewed the show unit of their new homes at an event on Oct 25.

"My dear uncles and aunties from Kampung Sungai Nibong Kecil and Sungai Nibong Tengah, today we bring you here with government authorities to see the beautiful homes you will be staying in so that you will not be led astray by ridiculous rumours," Gee Su Lyn, director of Hunza Realty Sdn Bhd told hundreds of squatters at the function in Bayan Lepas.

Hunza Properties Berhad had acquired a piece of land measuring 43 acres with 823 structures six years ago.

Out of that number, 750 accepted their resettlement compensation package.

Despite facing many challenges, Hunza successfully resettled the squatters with the help of the state government, especially Pantai Jerjak assemblymember Datuk Mohd. Rashid Hasnon who is also Deputy Chief Minister I, Bayan Baru MP Sim Tze Tzin who is also the former Pantai Jerjak assemblymember and government agen-

Although a small section of the squatters did not accept the resettlement package, the majority had either taken up homes in Bertam, accepted cash compensation of RM42,000 or were looking forward to move into to the RM42,000 flat at Bayu Nyaman



The 680 sq ft flat has three bedrooms and is worth over RM130,000 in the market.

Hunza founder Datuk Seri Khor Teng Tong explained why his company had provided the RM42,000 unit which actually cost RM100,000 to build.

"It is a social compensation package. I believe we must have broken the Malaysian record for providing compensations to squatters that reached close to RM100 million for the land that we acquired," he said.

Khor also thanked Rashid for his help.

"Datuk Rashid had helped to identify those who are eligible and he and his people had gone to the ground to investigate and provide the families with various options," he added.

Meanwhile, Rashid asserted that it is the Penang state government's policy to ensure that no squatters were left out and worked hard for a win-win situation between landowner and squatters.

In his speech, Rashid spoke to the people who were formerly from the two kampungs.

"As your assemblymember, I made sure that none of you were left out when the land was acquired by the new landowner. Today, I am very happy to meet all of you here and to have a site visit at this topping up ceremony. The flats you will move in have been built up to Level 28. As

you can see, the unit is like a medium-cost flat.'

The people who are going to move in to the new flat next year are certainly very excited as the unit is beautiful and spacious.

This is a far cry from their homes in the Kampung Sungai Nibong Kecil as some units did not have proper drainage and rubbish disposal.

In her closing speech, Gee reminded those who had not taken up the resettlement package to do so before the opportunity closes upon them. "The people should be thankful of the state government's constant eye on the people's dwelling woes that they have always had landowners and developers to come up with resettlement dwellings for the affected people/squatters," Gee said.

Developers agree with relaxed housing rules

LAST month, a new category of affordable housing was introduced.

At the same time, in order to stimulate the development of such affordable housing. it has also been decided that 30% of the units in any particular 100% affordable housing project may be sold on the open market, on condition that the said units are to be sold at 10% above the controlled price in all districts except the Northeast district, where it is to be sold 20% above the controlled price.

"We have taken into consideration those who previously earned RM6,000 who were eligible for such affordable housing, and for this category, we have now introduced a new category of affordable housing, namely units priced at RM150,000. These units are also sized at a minimum of 750 sq ft, but without finishing (unlike the RM200,000 units)," exco member Jagdeep Singh Deo said in a press statement dated Oct 12.

Buletin Mutiara sought the comments from Real Estate and Housing Developers Association, Penang (Rehda) Penang chairman Datuk Jerry Chan.

"It is good to create the new category of RM150,000 affordable homes to cater for those with nett household income cap of RM6,000. I would call these RM150,000 units as 'intermediate medium cost' or IMC. However, I disagree with the 750 sq ft requirement as not everyone needs three rooms. It will be extremely difficult for developers to build 750 sq ft, RM150,000 units," Chan said.

Meanwhile, Chan agreed that it is a good move regarding the opening of 30% of the affordable units to the

"This is a good move as this is a win-win arrangement for both the buying public and developers since there are not enough qualified buyers through the state's registration list. The five-year post completion lock-up period will create an increased supply of rental units," he added.

Chan also agreed with the 20% "surcharge/levy" for affordable homes in the Northeast district, where it is to be sold 20% above the controlled price and 10% for other districts.

"This is correct as it protects the qualified buyers and their entry costs," he said.

Jagdeep foresees a surge in demand and urged those interested to purchase affordable homes to "act fast and not delay, as with these new measures in place, I am certain that the said units will be taken up very quick-

2016预算案槟遭遗忘首长: 槟城只能靠自己

"首相在其任职期间曾 3次许诺,惟每次的承诺 都只是空头支票。因此, 对于这种槟州被忽略及边 缘化的行为,槟州行政。 会要表达深切的遗憾,而 且这是不应该发生的情 况。这是违反宪法、 马来西亚精神。"

他补充,正如在首相于去年宣布的"发展催化城市"(Growth Catalyst Cities)计划中,4个重点城市分别是吉隆坡、新山、古晋及亚庇,槟城却被忽略及边缘化。

槟州首长林冠英于10 月24日召开记者会时直 批,最明显的是,尽管 使用量低的马六甲机场 仍在财政预算案下获得 拨款进行扩建工程,反 观载客量已爆满的槟城 国际机场,却没任何新 扩建发展计划。

他也说,从财政预算案报告中,联邦政府从财政预算案税取得390亿令吉的收入,在抵消原有的销售税及服务税后,实际净收入为210令吉,然而联邦政府从中只回扣7亿6400万令吉给人民,这相等于联邦政府向人民收取了26令吉,不过却给回1令吉。

"很英雄吗?当人民是 愚蠢的吗?向人民收取 了26令吉,却只给回1令 吉。"

巫统大厦避雷针结构及槟城二桥引桥结构坍塌事件的调查报告出炉,证实是严重的人为疏忽,槟州首长林冠英宣布,槟州行政议会成立以槟州房屋委员会主席佳日星行政议员为首的行政议会调查小组,负责该2起事件的后续工作,包括建议追究、检讨及改善工作。

林冠英表示, 巫统大厦避雷针结构 坍塌导致2人罹难, 分别是林振益及 一名外劳, 如果林振益家属准备起诉巫统大厦业主, 槟州政府准备给予法律援助。他说, 行政议会调查 小组以槟州房屋委员会主席佳日星行政议员为首, 成员包括槟州福利

委员会主席彭文宝行政议员、槟州 工程及基本建设委员会主席林峰成 行政议员、槟州宗教事务委员会主 席拿督阿都玛烈行政议员及槟州法 律顾问拿督法伊扎。

他说,已有191间无牌酒店已被列入非法酒店漂白名单内,同时可获得临时准证,而且可看到有许多业者争取机会提出申请,惟还是有业者仍无动于衷。

·马机构及捐款丑闻致令吉贬值

消费税为经济低迷罪魁祸首

消费税是经济低迷的罪魁祸首,一马机构420亿令吉丑闻以及26亿令吉 捐款丑闻则是令吉贬值的主因。

槟州首长林冠英指出,联邦政府一日不废除消费税、降低油价、冻结过路费及列出让马币价值回稳的具体措施,2016年财政预算案将不会解决马来西亚的经济危机,也无法提高人民的生活水平。

同时也是峇眼区国会议员的林冠英于10月26日发表文告时表示,联邦政在2016年财政预算案的报道中承认,消费税解救了由全球原产品及石油价格走势低迷所导致的联邦政府破产危机、当局原本甚至可能没有办法支付公务员薪水。

"明年,政府预计明年可在消费税取得390亿令吉的收入,比起销售与服务税的180亿令吉,多了210亿令吉。这笔向3000万名马来西亚人口征收的210亿令吉解救了政府,而不是富有的朋党石油公司或大道公司。"

"2016年预算案里派的糖果,只是 联邦政府在拿走了普通老百姓的210 亿令吉后的粉饰配套。事实上,比起 已经废除、向商家收取的销售及服 务税所能征收的180亿令吉,政府实 际上从人民中袋取走390亿令吉。换 句话说,马来西亚人民在消费税实施 后,直接支付了390亿令吉,比起之 前商家只需要缴付180亿令吉。"

他续称,消费税导致普通老百姓受苦,不够钱应付日常开销甚至百物上涨。

"2016年预算案口口声声说归还 人民,但是,从联邦政府税收中回 馈给人民的数额约7亿6400万令吉而已。从人民口袋拿走390亿令吉或净收210亿,但只是归还7亿6400万令吉,这算什么糖果预算案?若依据210亿令吉的消费税净收入,相等于国阵向人民拿了26令吉,却只归还1令吉给人民。"

"大道过路费上调、汽油价格上涨(尽管全球油价走势下调),联邦政府要怎样减轻人民负担? 2016年财政预算案有没有办法上马币价格回升? 如果马币价格没有从目前的一美元兑4.30令吉,回升至3.70-80的情况,国阵会不会承认2016年预算案是一个失败的预算案?"

"2016年财政预算案如何应对联邦政府节节上升的债务?政府债务从2007年底的2660亿令吉,增加至2015年6月的6275亿令吉。如果把或有负债算进去,到了2016年,联邦政府的债务将高达8040亿令吉,这意味着联邦政府的债务在9年内上升了3倍!"

他指出,这笔债务意味着每个马来 西亚国民欠债2万6800令吉。债务清 偿成本已经提高至266亿4000万令 吉,即平均每人856令吉。

"无论政府在2016年财政预算案中派什么糖果,这些糖果是否足够让人民应付消费税实施后百物上涨的困境。很多人说没有消费税之前日子比较好过。我相信,如果人民可以不要消费税,他们宁可没有2016年预算案的糖果。"

他续称,这就是国阵及希望联盟预 算案的差别,希望联盟预算案志在拯 救经济,废除消费税、冻结过路费上 调、降低油价、解决一马机构420亿 令吉金融丑闻及26亿捐款丑闻,以让 马币价格回升。"

"我要代表槟州政府针对槟城没有 发展项目感到遗憾。为什么槟城国际 机场没有扩建工程?它的承载量估计 将在今年冲破极限。为什么当局没有 实行首相三次答应的公共交通如轻快 铁?"

"首相也在今年哈芝节答应协助槟州水灾灾黎,我也已经致函要求8亿500万令吉的水灾防治援助,但是没有下文。我要提醒联邦政府,槟城每年贡献65亿令吉的税收,唯有槟城不被忽视及边缘化才算公平。"

他续称,2016年财政预算案并没有 谈及马来西亚要如何逃离中等收入陷 阱,达到1万5000美元的人均国内生 产总值,去年我国人均国内生产总值 只有1万830美元。今年到2020年, 马来西亚的人均国内生产总值需要每 年增加平均695美元,但是以目前一 美元总4.30令吉的情况看来是不可能 的。

"是时候马来西亚探索包容性增长,而不只是可持续,还必须免于贪污、并涵盖社会各界。我们必须有一个进步的经济政策,让财富创造议程立基于"财富创造者"的合作,不只是生意人,也包括工人、公共机构及公民社会组织。一个进步的经济政策以投资为主导、包容性及可持续以创造财富,通过公私合作主导长期的增长及生产。"

"换句话说,做为一个企业型政策,政府扮演提供公共用品、服务、 基本建设的催化剂角色,政府也刺激 关键高风险工业的发展。那就是一个政府需要投资在高风险领域如:研究及发展、创新、培训及再培训方面引领投资,这些是私人领域不会碰的。在其它方面,特别是私人界已经做出一番成就的部分,政府的责任是革新政府,把生意留给私人界。"

他补充,解决"劣质资本主义(垄断及朋党)"的最好办法是发扬"优良资本主义(竞争及革新)"的长处。正如就业能力才重要,而不是雇用率,惟可以看到,联邦政府太过注重垄断及朋党,导致财政预算赤字那么多年。

"看看我们的失业率3.2%,估计明年会降到2.9%,质量与数量一样重要。"

"最后,为什么在2015年财政预算案中答应拨给华小淡小的8亿令吉今年还没有发放?政府能不能解释为什么今年度的拨款已经减少至5亿令吉?在数位部长喊话说要单元流教育制度并关闭华校后,首相拿督斯里纳吉保证政府将保留华小淡小,但是拨款减少要如何说明上述保证是可靠的?"

黎校长的文集常引經據典,引述 论语等經典。文学底子要强,才能 读懂他的文章。他的文章也包含了 人生哲学,他的处世观及人生观。

他那一篇《教师匠的话》是他-生中对其教育及政治工作反思的 话。孔子何嘗不是周遊列国,一心 向諸王献策但未成。后来孔子以教 育天下为己任,成了萬世师表,名 留青史。

《我国的财务管理》

理财这门学问是非常重要的,对政 府机构而言, 谨慎理财尤其重要, 因 为它管理的是纳税人的血汗钱,也是 所有人民的钱。这些钱只能用来造福 人民, 并不属于任何一个政府官员 的,所以政府必须确保所有的钱财进 出都有被谨慎管理, 所有的资金流向 和财务情况都可以给人民一个明确的 交代。

然而, 在马来西亚, 我国政府在行 政操作和理财方面都出现了很大的问 题。国家高教贷款基金 (PTPTN) 被 借贷者拖欠巨额贷款,就是理财不善 的典型例子。PTPTN这么多年来帮助 不少年轻学子完成高等教育,可是借 贷者欠款,过河拆桥,欠贷者多达60 万5千685人,拖欠政府47亿令吉。 奇怪的是,其中有28万欠贷者是目 前在政府部门就职的,有些还是高职 的,可是政府还允许这些欠贷者继 续捧着国家的铁饭碗,让他们逍遥法

从马哈迪时代到今天的纳吉,国阵 政府在处理国家的财务方面都非常的 神秘。一旦被揭发有任何差错时,政 府及警察不是立刻调查那些有关被指 贪污、滥权的政府高官, 反而是忙着 找出和对付那些揭密者。对于一马公 司(IMDB)的事件,至今我们还在 等待政府给予一个明确的交代, 政府 尤其是首相必须让人民了解整个26亿 令吉献金事件的来龙去脉。然而,让 人民非常不满的是, 任何人似乎都不 可过问我国的资金流向和财务情况, 尤其是提问或发表有关1MDB的言 论,如果再有人站出来指控纳吉非法 把公款转进其个人户口, 不知会否像 林良实的下场一样,被首相纳吉告他 诽谤。

我国的财务状况已经生病了,有史 以来首相因被指涉嫌私用献金而告前 任国阵部长, 连国会议员在国会批评 有关公账会暂停调查1MDB会议的言 论也被终止议员资格半年,而1MDB 与其全资子公司获得豁免缴税十年却 无人可过问。如果公家财务的管理和 监督不尽善妥当和透明化,人民代议 士也无权为人民发表责问国家的财务 及管理状况,这样下去我国的财务管 理还有希望吗?

《一带一路与槟城》

最近, 打开报章, 我们就会 看到"一带一路",到底,这 是什么? 它又如何利惠我国和 槟城?

其实,一带一路是由中国国 家主席习近平于2013年9月和 10月分别提出的经济合作概 念,属于跨国经济带。它成为 中国对外的主要经济战略,目 前已有60国家和国际组织响 应一带一路,这些国家的总人 口约44亿,经济总量约21万 亿美元,分别占全世界的63% 和29%。

这从中亚到欧洲、从东南亚 到南亚和非洲——范围从基础 设施建设扩大到贸易和投资。 这项尽力迎合所有人的无所不 包的计划涵盖了全球超过60% 的人口。

槟城, 其实就处在这一带一 路的战略发展策略性地点的重 要位置,所以,只要槟城捉着 这个百年难得的国际际遇,积 极参与一带一路的发展计划, 将会带动槟州甚至全马经济的 发展。

中国是东盟最大的贸易伙 伴。东盟是中国的第三大贸易 伙伴, 仅次于欧盟和美国。大 多数海外华人生活在东南亚。 商品、人员和资金双向流动的 扩大将推动双方的经济增长。 基本上,「一带一路」可为中 国大陆经济寻找出路,透过与 周边国家发展相结合,不仅 先要打造中国与东协经济自贸 区的升级版,也进一步与周 边国家建立更密切的经济发展 关系。进一步而言, 「一带一 路」的战略计画可以将亚洲发 展与中国发展相结合,再加上 亚投银的设立,将为次区域基 础设施建设带来新契机,为「 一带一路」战略提供有利的支 持基础。

有关计划,透过铁路、高 铁、公路、水运、航空的发展 有利于双边国家经济发展,也 推动了劳务、商品、资金、农 业、产业和技术的往来交流, 有助落实多赢的经济发展格 局。

届时,马来西亚的产品,特 别是槟城人经营的商品,可更 有效及快捷的与中国当局促成 交易,同时,这计划下也可吸 引更多中方投资者前来槟城进 行各项的投资项目(包括了大 型的基本建设如海底隧道), 这也符合了中方与槟城的经济 利益。

无论喜欢与否, 我们不能否 定经过30年的改革开放,中 国已经成功的和平崛起,目 前是全世界第二大经济体, 仅次于美国,目前只要中国 打一个哈欠,全球经济都会 受到影响,所以,无论是我 国政府、槟州政府、各方面 业者等,都应该捉着这个难 得机遇, 踏上中国龙强势崛 起的顺风车,一起开拓商 机, 让我国和槟城在这股大 发展洪流中受惠, 而非被这 大洪流排除在外。

《失望的2016财政预算案》

第一,基本上它并没有什么明确的方案来减 少人民日益加重的生活负担或提高人民收入。 政府也没对人民目前所面对的困境,包括马币 贬值、交通路费调涨、油价调涨、消费税负 担、通货膨胀等加以管制。消费税让国家收入 增多210亿令吉,这的确救了纳吉,却害惨了 人民。

以马来西亚现有2800万人口统计,公务员与

全国人口的对比,就是1对19.72人。换言之, 平均20人当中,就有一人是公务员。新加坡的 比率是1对71.4人、韩国则是1对50人、英国1 对118人、中国是1对108.3, 所见, 我国公务 员体系实在太臃肿。

日前近50名非政府组织代表、专业人士、地 方领袖和居民们在马章武莫服务中心一起讨论 各项针对2016年财政预算案的建议和回馈, 并总结出州政府和中央政府在制定财政预算 案,和人民代议士在辩论财政预算案时需关注 的十个事项。

举办这场《人民要什么?》2016年财政预 算案对话会(马章武莫阶段),是希望通过集 思广益的方式来搜集民意,并让参加者们协助 拟定符合人民需求的州议会提问,并在11月 举行的州议会里参与财政预算案的辩论。

"人民是老板"不是一个口号,其中也包括 了解政府的预算案分配、收入来源、行政开销 和发展开销,并积极参与跟财政预算案有关的 咨询会等责任。

其实,不是很多人知道,很厚一本的财政预

槟岛市议员李俊杰指出, 普通停 车格的面积是2.7公尺宽、6公尺 长,而加大加宽后的停车格是3.6 公尺宽及6.8公尺长,并且当局也 将原本的黄色油漆成蓝色, 那就是 国际能力差异人士的停车格颜色。

他说,加大后的停车格是为了方 便能力差异人士停车及上下车, 尤其是使用轮椅的能力差异人 士,因此,他促请民众不要占用 这些停车格,因为能力差异人士 比一般人更需要这些停车格。

然而,能力差异人士需要先向市 政厅申请官方贴纸并张贴在车镜 上,否则在没有相关贴纸的情况 下, 执法人员无法确认车主是能 力差异人士的话, 还是会开出罚 单给没有贴纸的车辆。

另外, 槟岛市议员黄顺祥则说, 全槟岛共有38个能力差异人士停 车格,而槟岛市政厅已发出500张 能力差异人士贴纸, 由此可见, 这38个停车格是非常珍贵,因 此, 他促请民众不要占用这些停 车格。

他续称,首批位于槟州大会堂及 法庭前的能力差异人士停车格在 油成蓝色, 取得良好效果, 现在 已没有人随意把车停放在能力差 异人士停车格里了。

他也说,除了能力差异人士本 身,他们的父母或子女也可以申 请贴纸,惟必须确保使用蓝色停 车格时,是载送着能力差异人 士。

马币贬值致经费不足 首长拨款10万令吉助续工

北海新芭观音亭斗母宫新宫工程因 马币贬值导致经费不足并影响进度, 槟州首长林冠英得知后宣布拨款10万 令吉,并希望民众能继续支持让工程 能顺利竣工。

林冠英指出,他是在九皇爷庆典走访该庙时得知有关工程因马币贬值而影响进度,因此宣布拨款10万令吉,并希望能藉此抛砖引玉,让工程继续得到民众的支持而顺利落成。

他说,人民不喜欢政府开空头支票,因此一旦政府许下诺言后就必须尽快履行承诺。

他以州政府推行制度化拨款举例, 这项拨款每年都在4个月内就差不多 分完给各校,而州政府更要求各校在 11月就提呈明年的制度化拨款申请, 并预计在明年正月的第一个礼拜就开 始移交拨款给独中。

他表示,华小至今依然等待联邦政府的5000万令吉拨款,尽管今年只剩下月2个月的时间,但当局却依旧无法明确交代有关拨款详情。

他呼吁当局能够严正看待此事,避 免让有关课题最终不了了之。

他赞扬首长及州政府以人民为先, 而该庙也希望能够效仿州政府让槟州 成为模范州的意愿,将该庙新宫打造 成模范庙,进而成为旅游景点。

黄伟益促联邦政府检讨教育拨款机制

丹绒区国会议员黄伟益促请联邦 政府检讨拨款机制,将财政预算案 内的教育拨款平分给各源流学校。

他指出,在2016年财政预算案内,当局预算了5亿令吉的拨款给个源流学校,不过到目前为止如何分配有关拨款仍存在很大的问题。

他表示,若根据过往的做法,华校可分配到的拨款向来很少,这包括在第9大马计划公佈时,华小所获得的拨款仅有1亿7000万令吉,或等于3.6%。

若以此类推,黄伟益担心华小在2016年能够获得的拨款,或只有约1800万令吉,而这笔款项或需和国民型中学共享,在这种情况下,每所学校仅能被分配到很少的拨款,或根本不足以推动包括扩建校舍等任何大型的计划。

他促请内阁重新检讨拨款给华小的机制,最好是 能够落实制度化拨款,同时也不要把华小分为全津 贴或半津贴,因为学校所需要的资源是一样的。

他补充,在联邦政府没有办法根据需求的情况下来分配拨款的话,最好的方式就是将拨款平均分配给所有学校。除非能够像槟州一样根据需求来分配拨款,这将会是更好的方案;若无法根据需求来分配,最好是用平分的原则来分配拨款。

"对我们来说教育是不需要被分配,但一些学校 扩建校舍,有一些比较大型的项目,那可能需要比

较多的资源,这个我们同意,但联邦政府向来没有 这样的机制,那就要公平分配。"

黄伟益是于10月25日移交首长拨款1万令吉予头条路斗母宫理事会后向媒体发表谈话。同时出席者包括理事会主席杨庆和、财政林发财及总务林琮松等人。

黄伟益表示,这是继首长去年拨款10万令吉后,再次拨款给该庙。而他本身之前也移交1万令吉拨款给该庙进行扩建工程。

杨庆和指出,该庙的扩建雨屋工程于去年中动工,至今已经85%,预计将在明年初竣工。有关工程共耗资250万令吉,目前尚欠缺50万令吉。

槟政府尽守本份收取税务回馈人民

尽管近来国家经济充满考验及挑战,槟州政府 将尽守本份,把所收取的税务及其他收费回馈人 民,进而减轻人民负担。

槟州首长林冠英指出,国内面对经济课题困扰,包括落实消费税、油价上涨、过路费调涨,以及一马发展公司(1MDB)的事件等等,让人民生活充满挑战。

他指出,州政府了人民所面对的问题,因在收取费用及税务后,依然将其用来回馈人民,包括 兴建基本设施等等,其中包括兴建巴刹、小贩中 心、民众会堂等等。

他表示,联邦政府落实消费税后,估计每年能够增收超过300亿的税收,这笔庞大的税务主要 是从人民,特别是小市民抽取的。

他说,槟州政府尽量减轻人民负担,更在槟岛市政厅及威省市政局方面替人民承担消费税,预计每年缴付2100万令吉消费税给联邦政府。

他指出,在马来西亚只有两个柔佛州及槟州提供这种便利,柔佛州是因为殿下指示,而槟州政府则主动提出为人民承担。

他指出,州政府无需人民感激,而是在尽本份 为人民服务,并收取的税务及其他收费回馈人 民,进而减轻人民负担。

章瑛指出,女性在职场向来面对 看不到, 摸不到, 却实际存在的玻 璃天花板困境,令一些高职仍不曾 由女性领袖出任。

"由于文化,习俗与社会对男女 的不同期望,导致女性,尤其是已 为人母的女性, 在就业升职时面对 更多障碍和挑战,以致许多女性在 还未到达高职就半途掉队,回到社 会固有思维框框中的舒适区,因而 促成我国有百分之80以上的领导 层,尤其是在政治和济领域都以男 性为主。

她说,男性领袖垄断公共领域 是"男主外,女主内"的分工模式 的结果,这是全世界的人类社会发 展模式, 这以男女生理不同而分工

的方式到今天这个注重人才和劳力 的时代, 在一些领域, 已形成限制 国家发展的障碍。

"例如,缺乏女性的声音在领导 层中反应,导致许多政策在制定时 往往忽略了女性的需要,引起不平 衡的局面, 忽略妇孺, 家庭和乐龄 人士所需的设备。政府在分配国家 资源时,大手笔地投入在足球建 设,却忽略了生育保健和托儿设备 建设就是一个很好的例子。

章瑛于10月29日发表文告时表 示,这样的局面导致职业妇女们常 在兼顾工作和家庭孩子而在日常生 活中面对着种种挑战,进而无法 专心一致、发挥出最大的潜能去贡 献于职场, 社会和国家发展; 这导 致越高层越少妇女决策者,另一方 面,又令社会误以为妇女没有能力 担任高职,所以在挑选升职领袖 时,令男性更占优势,这是玻璃天 花扳形成的综合原因。



Caring MBPP helps the disabled

INDEPENDENT living by the disabled community has received positive support from Penang Island City Council (MBPP) and the Penang Women Development Council (PWDC).

G. Suresh, 43, lives on his own at the Jalan Sungai Pinang public housing flat and makes a living selling mobile phone top-up cards at Lorong Kulit.

"I rent a room here with two other disabled persons. Currently there are three rooms and we move about with our wheelchairs. It is good to know that MBPP is going to renovate the flat to make it more convenient for us," Suresh said when Sungai Pinang assemblymember Lim Siew Khim and MBPP councillors visited his home.

Lim explained why the efforts were taken to renovate the flats.

"The Penang state government is a

caring and people-centric government. Therefore, we want to ensure that all communities are taken care of, including the OKU living in public housing. So we are taking steps to renovate six units of MBPP public flats to make them

more accessible for the disabled. We hope private developers will also take the initiative to do the same," she said.

MBPP councillor Joseph Ng said the council and PWDC under the Gender Responsive and Participatory Budget will allocate RM350,000 to renovate six units of public flats at Jalan Sungai Pinang.

Bigger toilets for OKU, bigger washing areas and kitchens, ramp and grab bars will be built and to make the space, three-room flats will be changed to two rooms.

"At the moment, four units of the flats are occupied by OKU but we are renovating six units. Therefore, all the OKUs will be able to move in to a better and bigger environment in six months. This is a pioneering project and we hope to continue catering to the needs of the OKU community as MBPP has a RM1 million budget for this purpose," Ng said.

Help spread message on i-Sejahtera

SPREAD the word on i-Sejahtera.

That was the message from exco member for state welfare, caring society and environment Phee Boon Poh during his speech at a ceremony in Komtar on Oct 24 on the programme for the disabled.

"Tell your neighbours and friends about i-Sejahtera. Help us to tell them that the Penang state has a programme for OKU and their next of kin. We have 20,000 OKU registered in Penang but so far only 8,664 of them are registered under i-Sejahtera," Phee said.

The event was to reward the next of kin of OKU who had passed away. The next of kin received RM1,000 as an appreciation for the love and care they had given to the OKU.

The disabled registered under i-Sejahtera received RM100 a year.

Other than this, OKU who are registered with the state welfare are also entitled to several other help such as financial aid, priority in using public facilities and others.

Chief Minister Lim Guan Eng was also in Komtar to meet the next of kin of OKU from Penang island.

"I extend my condolences for the loss of your loved ones. Thank you for caring for them. I know it hasn't been easy but your love and care

had given them strength to live with dignity. Though the money given is not much, it is to tell you that the Penang state has not forgotten you or your loved ones," Lim said in his speech.

One of the recipients was Abdul Rani Md. Hassan, 62, who was there to collect the money after his son, Mohd. Raimi, 30, passed away.

Abdul Rani said he heard about the programme from friends and registered.

RM2.2 million for fishermen, crew

FISHERMEN who were affected by the Seri Tanjung Pinang Phase 2 (STP2) reclamation project off the northeast cost of Tanjung Tokong together with their crew were in Komtar to receive ex-gratia payment on Oct 31.

"The reclamation project was handed down from the previous government and we, as the new state government, respected the contract signed. We are bound by the law and we honour it," Chief Minister Lim Guan Eng said during the payment of the ex-gratia to the 44 fishermen and crew.

A total of RM2,210,500 had been given out in several phases.

The first round of ex-gratia payment amounting to RM1.852 million was given out in July to 116 fishermen and crew, contributed by STP2 project developer Eastern & Oriental Berhad (E&O).

The second phase consisted of 31 fishermen and 13 crew.

"Fishing is an important sector as farming. The state will continue to support and help the fishermen to develop the fishing industry. We have also given out fishing nets to assist fishermen since we took over the administration of the state. This was never

done before 2008. This year, in May, some 3,186 fishermen had received the nets amounting to RM531,759.65. Another batch of fishing nets will be given out in November involving 3,121 fishermen costing RM557,439.50," Lim said.

The event was witnessed by Dr Afif Bahardin, exco member for Agriculture, Agro-based industries, Rural development and Health and Eastern & Oriental Property (Penang) Sdn Bhd general manager Zawawi Yusop.

Dr Afif said due care had been given to select those who qualified for the ex-gratia payment, with RM15,000 given to 14 active fishermen, RM7,500 to 17 licensed fishermen, RM2,000 to the crew and RM1,000 to the nonactive crew.

"He chose the righteous path, which is often a lonely path, but the legacy he has left as a committed and honest public servant, true to his oath of office, is a reminder to each one of us that no matter how lonely the righteous path may seem, in the end, you are not alone. This attendance today sends a message to Kevin and his family - You are not alone!" Lim said.

Kevin's brother Datuk Richard Morais and other family members were in Komtar too.

Based on media reports, Kevin was a victim of one of the most vicious and tragic crimes ever perpetrated against an individual and a public officer.

One of the accused persons charged for this heinous crime is the same accused in a corruption case in the Shah Alam court that Kevin was prosecuting.

Councillor who believes in differing opinions

PENANG Island City Council (MBPP) councillor Lim Boon Beng caught the attention of Buletin Mutiara when he stood alone against the decision made by his fellow councillors to increase parking compounds.

Intrigued, Buletin Mutiara sought to interview him.

Lim, 41 is single and is a lawyer by profession.

He was appointed as a councillor in 2013 and holds several portfolios as follows:

- alternate chairman for MBPP Enforcement and Education Committee
- committee member in MBPP Health and Licensing Committee.
- committee member in MBPP Finance Committee.

Lim has a motto, "A small leak will sink a great ship", and was very concerned about specific decisions and council policies.

"Any decision made by the council on an individual application or a policy issue affecting the general public at large will have far reaching effects, and trigger an impression by the public on the administration of local councils; thus, be indirectly related to the state government," he said.

Lim wishes to improve the services to the public by council staff.

"It has to be provision of convenience to the people, prompt action and immediate response," he said.

When asked why he had voted against the increase of parking compounds, Lim said: "Firstly, we have to ensure sufficiency of car parking lots before imposing a



heavier fine/compound. Secondly, the current economic factor is not favourable to the people. They are burdened with GST and increases in goods prices, whereas the council is not facing a financial crisis."

So, how does it feel to be the lone voice when his other colleagues support the increase of parking compounds?

"We are deliberating on public issues and not something personal against one another. I think my colleagues are wise enough to understand those facts. It is right and nothing is wrong to have different opinion amongst councillors. It is not a teacher persuading school children; perhaps increasing the amount of compounds is more convincing," he said.

"We are dealing with human conduct and behaviour. Some people (public) may agree but another may not. For me, I would rather

take the majority favoured approach," Lim added.

It is to be noted that the parking compound which was initially increased from RM30 to RM100 was eventually reduced to RM50, which is an increase of RM20 and not RM70.

Dormitories for foreign workers

EARLIER in July, Penang state government approved the proposals and guidelines for building foreign workers' dormitories.

Currently Penang does not have any specific area for dormitories for foreign workers, leading to them staying among the public in housing areas.

Exco member for Town and Country Planning and Housing Jagdeep Singh Deo held a short press conference regarding this issue on Nov 1.

"We came up with this idea last year and recently the guidelines were approved by the state government. I am hoping that this proper and regulated housing scheme for foreign workers will give them a better place to stay," he said.

Penang is home to a number of multinational corporations (MNCs), so their workers are subject to international guidelines where certain standards must be met in terms of size and facilities.

These international guidelines are incorporated into the approved guidelines for the dormitory development project.

This dormitory development project has to be in either commercial or industrial zones only.

Facilities such as kitchen, provisional store, medical, quarantine, and sports facilities are also stipulated in the guidelines.

Potential areas for the dormitory development would be in Batu Maung and Bukit Minyak as these are the popular industrial zones.

Jagdeep hopes that development and construction of these dormitories will be able to begin as soon as 2016.

STEPPING into Summer Garden Restaurant at lunch time, one cannot help but notice Tomy Yeoh taking orders from customers, serving food and manning the bar as and when time permits!

The boyish-looking Yeoh, 31, could be easily mistaken as a part time waiter who's studying at nearby Tunku Abdul Rahman College (TARC) but he's actually the son of the proprietor cum main cook Jane Phung.

And Yeoh not only serves but

cooks too as he's in charge of the Western cuisine section at Summer Garden.

Summer Garden specialises in Nyonya cuisine but it also serves Western fusion and Japanese cuisine.

"Summer Garden started operations nine years ago serving Western delights. I love cooking and because it's more like a hobby to me, I always take note of the likes and dislikes of my customers because it's something I want to do well in. What I discovered was, Penangites are

still very much passionate of their traditional dishes with that special exquisite taste that can hardly be relished elsewhere. Since I'm adept at preparing Nyonya dishes, I thought to myself 'why not'?" Phung explained when asked about the odd mix

"That decision also blended well with the promotion of heritage by the state government. People are now more inclined towards traditions and culture when it comes to food," she



added.

Ju Hu Char is a dish made up mainly of shredded vegetables like turnip or jicama, carrot and cabbage and fried together with thinly shredded dried cuttlefish.

The very purpose of the cabbage placed at the side of the dish is to wrap the other vegetables that make up the dish.

The Perut Ikan was served in a claypot and this explains the reason it remains warm after brought out from the kitchen for some time

A simply "must have" for any Nyonya cuisine gathering, this dish derives its distinctive taste from fish belly cooked in a spicy stew and preserved in brine and "daun kaduk" (wild pepper leaf).

It comes with mainly vegetables and herbs.

Most appealing of all was the soy sauce meat belly served in thick black gravy. Phung explained that the meat was chosen for its fat and marinated overnight with herbs and spices and cooked over a slow fire and then simmered to tenderness.

Nothing else goes better with

rice as far as this particular dish is concerned

Besides serving what is available on the menu, another distinctive feature of Summer Garden or Phung for that matter, is that she also prepares and serves her home cooked dishes.

Dubbed "Si Fong Choy" which literally means "Personal Household Cuisine" in Cantonese, such dishes are prepared by means of the personal recipe, knowledge, skills, years of experience and style of the cook which cannot be had anywhere else.

And as a compliment to Phung, two customers, who

were Nyonyas, remarked on the authenticity of Phung's cooking which reminded them of their grandmother's culinary skills.

Evidently, Summer Garden is the place to go to for "Kochabee" (colloquially means traditional taste) Nyonya dishes.

Summer Garden is located at No. 2 Lorong Lembah Permai 3, 11200 Tanjung Bungah.

Its business hours are 11am to 3pm and 5.30pm to 10.30pm.

It is closed on Tuesdays.

When the taxman knocks twice

A CERTAIN loophole that appears in the implementation of the Goods and Services Tax (GST) which specially affects prepaid mobile users has come to the attention of Penang Island City Council (MBPP) councillor Chris Lee Chun Kit.

At a press conference on Oct 24 to shed light on this matter, which is a classic case of double taxation, Lee together with Freddy Cheok, 45, who experienced this loophole first-hand, lamented on the unnecessary and addi-

tional burden on the public while telecommunication companies reap additional profit.

"I am a prepaid mobile user with credit of RM138.67 in my phone and reload cards purchased before April 1 totalling RM163.67 of which RM9.82 has been paid as Sales & Services Tax (SST). Under the Cabinet decision announced by Minister Shabery Cheek (then Communication and Multimedia Minister Datuk Seri Ahmad Shabery Cheek) back in May 2015, telcos are given a maximum of six months to imple-

ment a new system where GST will be imposed only when calls are made," Cheok explained.

"This means that having already paid the SST before April 1, when I make calls at the end of 2015 when this new system is implemented, I will again be charged GST. I have spoken to representatives at Penang Customs several times since May 19 but they are unable to tell me how I can avoid paying both SST and GST." he added.

According to figures released by the Malaysian Communications and Multimedia Commission (MCMC), there are a total of 36 million mobile prepaid users in Malaysia and this double taxation is a blatant contravention of what is stated in the Goods and Services Tax Act 2014 which had repealed both the Sales Tax Act 1972 and Service Tax Act 1975.

"The federal government has to address this loophole. As long as this matter is not addressed, the government is actually going against the Goods and Services Tax Act which they promulgated in the first place and double taxing the people," Lee said.

"The question is, how is the money being owed going to be returned to the people? Some people actually went to the telecommunication companies to request the return of the money and I believe some of them have been successful in getting the money directly from these telcos. But the bottomline is, the problem lies not with the telcos. The issue is not about the telcos. The money is from the average consumers who are doubly taxed," he said.

Festive mood made even merrier

THE festive mood to celebrate the Nine Emperor God Festival at the renowned Tow Boo Kong temple and Guan Yin Ting Dou Mu Gong temple could not get any better when Chief Minister Lim Guan Eng visited both temples on Oct 18.

Both temples are located along Jalan Raja Uda, Butterworth and are only a stone's throw away from one another and

furthermore, both are within Lim's parliamentary constituency of Bagan.

Welcoming Lim at his first stop at the Tow Boo Kong were temple committee chairman Khor Wan Tat and Federation of Malaysian Tow Boo Kong temples president Datuk Lee Hean Guan.

Lim and his entourage, who were treated to a vegetarian lunch by the temple committee. also expressed his hopes for Tow Boo Kong to play a leading role in the promotion of good moral values among the people.


